This is our Newsletter keeping you up-to-date with what's happening both in and around our 4 locations. To celebrate Bristol being awarded European Green Capital in 2015, we thought we would highlight a few of our licensees who are at the forefront of the green economy.

Bristol Spaceworks' mission over the last 30 years has been to provide employment opportunities in Easton and Lawrence Hill through affordable workspace. We are very pleased to announce that we have made a significant donation towards the charity [Fredericks Foundation](#) who share similar goals and ambitions to ours. Fredericks provide loans to help disadvantaged individuals enter into self-employment or grow an existing business. The money Bristol Spaceworks has provided will help support their activities across Bristol.

Clean Energy Prospector at Easton Business Centre, are at the sharp end of the 'Internet of Things' revolution, connecting our appliances and gadgets to the internet. They have a wide range of interests, such as developing [smart solar meters](#) which connect to the internet to provide automatic readings and letting you know if your solar panels have a fault.

They have recently won a grant, subject to planning permission, to create the CHOICES Energy Centre at Easton Community Centre which will provide renewable heat and power. Heat in the Summer will be stored in the ground near to the Centre and used in the Winter making the Centre carbon neutral.

[Demand Energy Equality](#) are based at Old Library site and raise awareness of energy and how its consumption can be reduced. They run practical workshops such as building DIY solar panels and aim to engage the public in energy issues. One high profile success you may have already seen in City Centre is The Energy Tree on Millennium Sq.

[The Energy Tree](#) was a project managed by Demand Energy Equality with volunteers from Bristol Drugs Project to create the 'solar panel leaves' and in partnership with the artist John Packer to make the metal tree structure. It is a public art installation and renewable power source providing free on-the-go phone charging and a WiFi hotspot.
